



The Certificate II in Racing (Stablehand) RGR20102 is an accredited training program for the role of employees who work under supervision and in known routines with a defined amount of responsibility and limited judgment. Trainee who successfully completes this qualification will have developed the following skills and knowledge:

- care for the thoroughbred and to meet their individual needs
- keeping the stable environment safe, clean and hygienic
- solutions to a limited range of problems
- work as part of a team

Program Content

Trainees need to complete the following 5 units for the qualification:

COMPULSORY UNITS

RGRH206A	Apply Occupational Health & Safety Procedures
RGRH207A	Handle Horses Safely
RGRH208A	Work Effectively in the Thoroughbred Racing Industry
RGRH209A	Care for Horses

ELECTIVE UNITS

RGRH310A	Oversee Safe Handling of Horses

Training and Assessment

Training and assessment will be flexible and, wherever possible, centered around your daily work tasks. Assessment is used to give you feedback on progress and measure your skills and knowledge against the training qualification requirements and those of your industry.

Training and assessment will take place in the workplace or training area, with your employer and Industry Training Consultant monitoring your progress. During the assessment process you will be required to provide evidence of your skills and knowledge through a variety of methods which may include: written work; work samples; oral questioning; observation; role plays and workplace projects.

Mutual Recognition

Racing Victoria Ltd recognises AQF Qualifications and Statements of Attainment issued by other RTOs under our 'Mutual Recognition' obligation. Originals of any AQF Qualifications or Statements of Attainment will need to be sighted prior to enrolment so that any exemptions can be identified and granted (in accordance with RVLETC's Credit Transfer and RPL/RCC policies and procedures).



Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

Participants who already possess the required knowledge and skills within specific units of competency (regardless of where or how these were acquired) may apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL). Participants who apply for RPL will need to provide evidence of their competence. Successful RPL applications will lead to exemptions from the identified unit/s of competency.

Entry requirements

Participants will need to demonstrate that they have the requisite English language, literacy and numeracy skills to be equivalent to level 2 of the National Reporting System as well as the ability to analyse and solve problems.

Certification

Participants who successfully complete the program of study will be issued with a Certificate II in Racing (Stablehand).
